The Power of Pivots

Dr. Aggarwal is currently a Founding Director of the Inflammation Research Center in San Diego and has been listed among top 100 most highly influential biomedical researchers in the world. While searching for novel and safe anti-inflammatory agents, his group identified more than fifty novel compounds from mother nature including spices, dietary agents and from Traditional Medicine. He has published almost 700 papers in peer-reviewed international journals, invited reviews and book chapters. Dr. Aggarwal is inventor/co-inventor on over 33 patents. He has been listed as one of the most highly cited scientist by the Institute of Scientific Information in the World. His publications exhibit high citations with over twenty publications exceeding 1000. His overall citation till now is 136,200 with an H-index of 192 (<https://scholar.google.com/citations?user=le7BLFUAAA&hl=en>)

Old Mission Rotary

COVID-19 has wreaked havoc with Old Mission Rotary's schedules but the Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary continues to award grants to help their community!

Here is a look at who they are supporting:

- Elderhelp of San Diego - \$1,420 for the purchase of portable video recording equipment.
- Mainly Mozart - \$8,000 for office equipment.
- Voices for Children - \$7,235 for updated furniture for its reception area and interview office in Kearny Mesa.
- San Diego Children's Choir - \$6,660 for new storage cabinets and office furniture.
- Alzheimer's San Diego - \$3,288 for equipment for hearing impaired attendees.
- Thousand Smiles Foundation - \$30,000 towards the new surgical suite at the Ensenada clinic.
- Foster Elementary PTA - \$6,700 for shade trees.

San Diego Regional HT-CSEC

The San Diego Human Trafficking & Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children recently presented a collaboration of Point Loma Nazarene University and the County of San Diego called (HT-RADAR) Human Trafficking Research and Data Advisory Roundtable program headed by Clara Anne Wagner. <https://ht-radar.abolishhumantrafficking.com/>
The monthly meeting covers multiple areas of support including: Health Services, Victim Services, Child Welfare, Education, Survivors, and Community.



The practices of the HT-RADAR program at the Center for Justice & Reconciliation at PLNU include:

1. Aggregating regional human trafficking related research;
2. Convening and facilitating collaboration between human trafficking data analysts and researchers;
3. Facilitating the networking of practitioners, data analysts, and researchers;
4. Identifying potential human trafficking research funding;
5. Improving public knowledge related to human trafficking
