The San Diego Downtown Breakfast Club (Tom Fitch) and the La Mesa Rotary Club #33 already have a collaboration with Anti Human Trafficking (AHT), sharing many updates/events as they go. Dani Womack the Past President of the La Mesa Rotary, is the Executive Director of City Hope https://cityhopenow.org, and is a passionate advocate.
